Section 2. Amendment of Section "7.A." of KSPL No. K8-207-09 relating to fees for Rock Island Use Permits.

Section. "7.A." of KSPL No. K8-207-09, as amended by KSPL No. K8-209-09 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"A. A Rock Island Use Permit must be purchased for a fee of \$50.00 for all Visitors who are six (6) years old and older. A Jellyfish Lake permit must be purchased for a fee of \$100.00 for all Visitors who are six (6) years old and older. Permits are valid for ten (10) days and are not transferable. Permits shall be available for purchase from the Koror State Finance Office or designated agents.

If any person has purchased a Rock Island Use Permit for \$50.00 that does not include Jellyfish Lake, and then that person decides he or she desires to visit Jellyfish Lake, such person shall pay an additional \$75.00 to visit Jellyfish Lake, in addition to paying the \$50.00 for the Rock Island Use Permit. The Tour Guide, Boat Operator, or Tour Operator shall either pay the difference in permit cost to Koror State, or if the Tour Guide, Boat Operator, or Tour Operator arrives at Jellyfish Lake and announces the intent to change the scope of the Rock Island Use Permit for the tourist, then Koror State may issue a voucher charging the additional fee of \$75.00 to the Tour Guide, Boat Operator, or Tour Operator, and the tourist may access Jellyfish Lake. The Tour Guide, Boat Operator, or Tour Operator shall pay the \$75.00 difference to Koror State within forty-eight (48) hours. If such additional fee is not paid within such forty-eight hour period, then the Tour Guide, Boat Operator, and the Tour Operator shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall pay a fine of \$250.00 upon conviction for a first offense, and a fine in the amount of \$500.00 upon conviction for a second and subsequent convictions. shall apply to each individual tourist who desires to change the scope of his or her Rock Island Use Permit. The Governor may promulgate regulations relating to the foregoing, which regulations shall have the force and effect of law, and a violation of the regulations shall be punished by a fine in the amount of \$250.00 upon conviction for a first offense, and a fine in the amount of \$500.00 upon conviction for a second and subsequent convictions."

Section 3. Amendment of Section "9.A." of KSPL No. K8-207-09 to allow the Governor to charge a reduced fee for official guests.

Section "9.A." of KSPL No. K8-207-09 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"A. The Governor, or his designee, may, in his discretion, provide a special grant of exemption from the requirements of this Act for Official Guests. Palauans and Resident Aliens may also be exempted by the Governor, or his designee, for the specific purpose of transporting or accompanying such Official Guests to such areas. The grant of exemption may be issued in consideration for the payment of a fee to be determined by the Governor. Such grant of exemption shall be in writing identifying the persons and dates of exemption, and shall be carried with the Official Guests at all times while in the Rock Islands."

Section 4. Severability.

The provisions of this Act are severable. If any part or portion of this Act is held to be invalid or unenforceable, then the offending portions may be stricken and the remaining portions shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Act shall be come effective upon its becoming law of the State of Koror by operation
