FIRST KOROR STATE LEGISLATURE KOROR PUBLIC LAW NO. K1-22-87 NINETEENTH SPECIAL SESSION, DECEMBER 1987(Passed as Bill No. 66-87)

AN ACT

To amend Koror State Law No. 2 (as amended by Koror Public Laws 21-62 and 8681) altering the sale of alcoholic beverages and curfew at New Year 1988.

THE PEOPLE OF KOROR REPRESENTED IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF KOROR DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDING.

In order to celebrate the new year 1988, it is in the public interest to allows public celebration and to allow the bars to remain open for entertainment past the normal closing time of midnight.

SECTION 2.

Article I of Koror State Law No. 2 (as amended by Koror Public Laws 21-62 and 86-81) is amended by adding the following section no. 5.

5. Notwithstanding the above sections 1 through 4, (a) the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises of sale, (b)

the consumption of such beverages on such premises, and (c) restaurants, bars, and other businesses serving food or alcoholic beverages shall

be allowed until 2:00 a.m. on January 1 and 2, 1988, and (d) pedestrian and vehicular traffic in order to permit persons to return to their homes shall be allowed until 2:30 a.m. January 1 and 2, 1988.
