#### AN ACT

To prohibit construction in the rock islands of Koror, to provide penalties for violations of this Act, and for related purposes.

# THE PEOPLE OF KOROR REPRESENTED IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF KOROR DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Findings. The Ninth Koror State Legislature hereby finds that any construction or development in the publicly owned rock islands of Koror may pose a threat to the fragile marine environment, particularly if there are overnight accommodations. The presence of buildings and lights, along with human activities, may have a detrimental effect on the environment, and upon wildlife.

The Legislature further finds that under 35 PNC 210(e), the Palau Public Lands Authority (PPLA) shall have the power to lease or make other disposition of public lands "with the approval of the government of the State within whose geographical boundaries the subject lands are situated and pursuant to the laws of the Republic and that state". 35 PNC 215© also provides that each State public lands Authority shall have such rights, interests, powers, responsibilities, duties, and obligations as may be granted by the PPLA, "provided that said grant and delegation by the Authority is limited only to those rights, interests, powers, responsibilities, duties, and obligations inherent in the Authority". Because the PPLA must receive the approval of the State government for leases of public lands, and because the Koror State Public Lands Authority (KSPLA) can have no rights greater that the PPLA, then the KSPLA must also receive the approval of the State of Koror for any leases of public lands. The Legislature therefore has the authority to prohibit the leasing of the rock islands which are public lands. Regardless of whether the lands are "public lands" or otherwise, the Legislature has been delegated the authority to "zone" all lands in Koror under 31 PNC 501-505 and related laws.

It is in the best interests of the people of the State of Koror to declare a moratorium on the erection of buildings and overnight accommodations at all beaches in the rock islands of Koror other than Koror State "summer houses" and similar tourist facilities.

# Section 2. Definition of construction; exceptions. As used in this Act:

(1) "construction" means any form of building, erection, or development, including the building of houses, hotels, hostels, apartments, sheds, shelters, lodging, or accommodations, and related facilities such as kitchens, cooking facilities, showers, baths, toilets, and other structures. This definition shall not apply to construction or improvements made or erected by Koror State Government or its contractors for the benefit of visitors to the rock islands, such as bio-toilets, summer houses, picnic tables and benches, cooking facilities, water catchment or storage, and similar improvements.

Governor for temporary structures not to exceed one (1) year in duration, after which time all such temporary structures shall be removed unless they remain for the benefit of tourists and/or local residents. No permission may be given for any private construction intended for the benefit of tourists.

(2) The prohibitions of this Act shall not apply to written exemptions granted by the

**Section 3.** <u>Prohibition against construction</u>. It is unlawful to engage in or to perform any construction in the State of Koror except on the following islands:

- (1) the island of Koror.
- (2) the island of Ngerkebesang.
- (3) Malakal Island.
- (4) the portion of Uchulangas known as Lot 40851 and Lot 40879, and Long Island.
- (5) the entire island consisting of Lots 40997, 40999, and 40587 (formerly known as "Cave Inn").
  - (6) any other small islets or islands joined by causeway or bridge to the foregoing;
- (7) this Act shall not affect or prohibit construction at "Dolphins Pacific", or at any other site that has been leased for development prior to the effective date of this Act.
- (8) this Act shall not prohibit the grant of authority by Koror State Government to "fill" marine areas below the ordinary high water mark on the islands of Koror, Ngerkebesang, Malakal, Long Island, or any written permission to fill any such areas granted before the effective date of this

Section 4. Penalties.

(1) Any person who violates any provision of this Act shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay fine in the amount of \$500.00 (five-hundred dollars). Each building, erection, or separately constructed facility shall be deemed a separate offense which may be separately punished.

- (2) Any person who aids, abets, counsels, commands, induces, or procures or causes the commission of an offense under this Act, which if directly performed by him would be a violation of this Act, shall be punished as a principal. No distinction is made between principals in degrees, and no distinction is made between a principal and what may be referred to as an accessory before the fact.
- (3) Each separate day that this Act is violated shall be deemed a separate offense, which may be punished separately. No offense shall be deemed continuing.

Section 5. Severability. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any part or portion of this Act are invalid or otherwise unenforceable, then the offending part or portions may be stricken, and the remaining portions shall continue in full force and effect.

**Section 6.** Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon its becoming law by operation of the Koror State Constitution.
