KSPL NO. <u>K7-144-2004</u> (Introduced as Bill No. 7 - 33, LD1, HD1)

AN ACT

To establish compensation scale for the Governor and all other employees of Koror State Government, to amend section "1.A." of KSPL No. K5-85-97 and to repeal section 15 of KSPL No. K6-104-99 relating to the salary of the Governor, and for other purposes.

THE PEOPLE OF KOROR REPRESENTED IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF KOROR DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 SECTION 1. <u>PURPOSE</u>. The purpose of this Act is to establish a new compensation
- 2 scale for the Governor of Koror State and to provide for a comprehensive pay scale with
- 3 employment and personnel system for regular Koror State Government employees.
- 4 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF SECTION "1.A." OF KOROR STATE PUBLIC
- 5 LAW NO. K5-85-97. Section "1.A." of Koror State Public Law No. K5-85-97 is hereby
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- A. The Governor of the State of Koror shall receive an annual salary of \$32,000.00 per
- 8 annum payable bi-weekly in 26 equal installments; and"
- 9 SECTION 3. <u>ALL OTHER EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS</u>. Pay scale and
- personnel system for all other employees and contractors of the state.
- 11 A. Within 180 days or six months from the effective date of this Act, the Governor
- shall formulate and submit to the Legislature a study and bill to establish a comprehensive
- salary and pay scale with employment and personnel system for all other state offices or
- 14 employees and contractors of Koror State Government other than members of the House of
- 15 Traditional Leaders, members of the Legislature, and Department Heads.
- B. The legislature shall enact into law no later than December 31, 2004, such pay scale
- with employment and personnel system.
- 18 C. Salary or pay rates currently applied to state offices, employees, or contractors shall
- remain in force until the new pay scale is enacted into law or otherwise amended by other laws.
- 20 SECTION 4. <u>OTHER ENUMERATION</u>. All branches, offices, or agencies of Koror

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- 21 State Government may receive any other enumeration such as representation, contingency, or
- other funds as specified in the annual budget law.

1	SECTION 5. REPEAL OF SECTION 15 OF KSPL NO. K6-104-99 AND CONFLICT
2	Section 15 of K6-104-99 is hereby repealed in its entirety. Any other state law that is found to
3	be in conflict with this Act shall be superseded and voided to the extent of such conflict.
4	SECTION 6. SEVERABILITY. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction
5	determines that any part or portion of this law is invalid, then such part or portion shall be
6	invalid but the remaining portions shall continue to be in full force and effect.
7	SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act shall take effect upon its becoming law by
8	operation of the Koror State constitution.
